

Fly-Bar Pony fender badges for the 2015-19 Mustang by J. Caliri

These are designed to go where the 5.0 badges attached. The backside of the badge has a slight curve to accommodate the fender shape. They don't have notches so figure out a way to get them aligned before you stick them on!!

I am not an expert in making car badges. in the end I decided not to use these on my car so I have no idea how long they will last etc.

They seem to be flexible enough to be placed near that general fender area.

Here is the info you need to give them for an order after you send them the files:

Process: Stereolithography

Material: Technicians Choice - High Res

Finish: Pattern

SIZE: VOL: 0.64, X 6", Y 1.49", Z 0.23"

I attempted to do a home chroming kit. It was ok but not perfect and the kit was expensive. So the second round I sent them to an expert:

As far as taping goes, I was going to use the same 3M tape used for most emblems. “3M VHB” (get out your exact knife or little scissors for the small contours.
